This is why I founded this foundation to contribute my own quota to see a society where every child is given a hope for a better tomorrow. She said the OHCF team's visit to the National Hospital Abuja is to support some patients in the children ward in the payment of their hospital bills and provide some provisions to help them recuperate speedily.

Miss Olivia disclosed that the OHCF team had earlier visited two schools, LEA Primary school and Government Secondary School Lugbe Secondary school to provide school uniforms and pay school fees for some indigent students.

On what inspired her vision her vision the young, intelligent and beautiful Olivia said 'I have always watched and read with keen interest the philanthropic activities of some great women like Chief Kennedy Uju the former Minister of Women Affairs and Dr. Aisha Achimugu the founder of SAM Empowerment Foundation and the great impact they and many others are making to leave their mark on the sand of time through helping and supporting the cause of humanity by giving back to the society and making life better for the under privileged in their own little way. This is the heartbeat of God to see men and women impacting and giving hopes to the human beings He created. In fact, these categories of women are my role models. They really inspire me.

On how she is able to raise money as a student to meet up these responsibilities. Olivia said *"You see it is something I am passionate about so I have been saving part of my pocket money while in school for this purpose and with the support of*

least 50 patients during our hospital outreaches for now in one year.

'We also intend to distribute clothing, shoes, pads and other necessities for personal care to at least 50 underprivileged children yearly. We will also strive to pay the school fees of at least 3 children per term which equal to 9 in a year and provide them also with educational and writing materials to assist them in their studies. We intend to increase the number of beneficiaries as time goes on especially when we receive more support but for now we work with the little resources at our disposal but we are not stopping there as we intend to be organizing programme for children/teenagers to help equip them with skills that will make them relevant in the society.'
