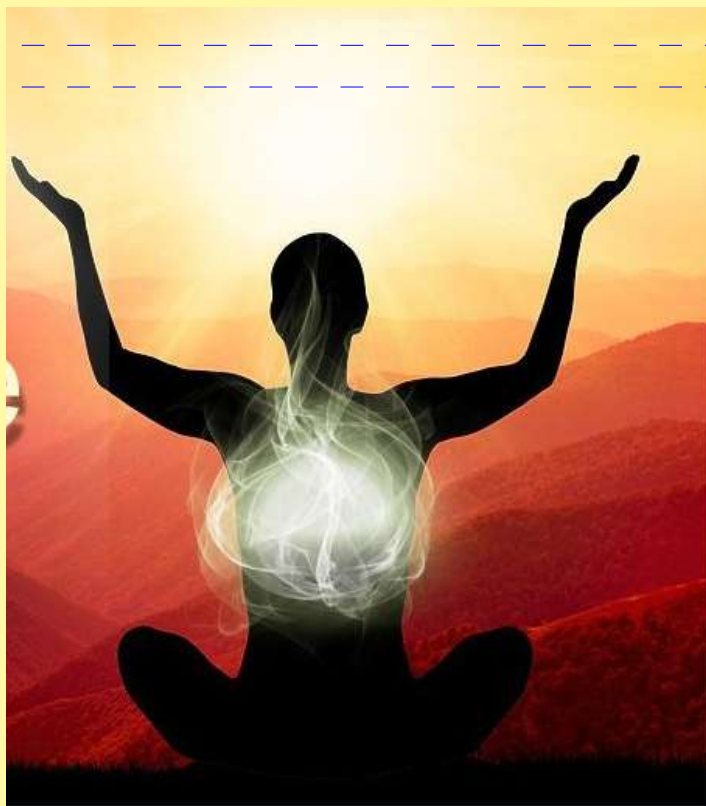
Some people will even tell you, "What's the point of keeping yourself for a man that might still cheat?" You'll
