If you line up such 1,515 units' long trucks, bumper to bumper, they will cover a stretch of 19km on the road and will require a crew of over 3,000 men to move them. Even the custom boss has queried the lies of the NNPC and they are still not tired of peddling it. The level of brazen roguery by these guys in Abuja will even intimidate Satan


